Duoderm® (P.A.W.S.)





Duoderm® is a type of bandage that can help to protect skin and treat skin breakdown. Your child's skin can become irritated and breakdown from things like pressure, excess wetness, and immobility.

Skin breakdown can range from an opening on the surface of the skin to a deeper wound.

What does the bandage look like?

- Tan in color
- Thin and flexible
- Adhesive or sticky back
- Circle or rectangle shape

Where can a Duoderm® bandage be placed?

- On bony areas
- Under drains/tubes
- o Under other equipment to prevent or treat skin breakdown

How do I care for the bandage?

Your child's nurse will show you how to apply the bandage. A Duoderm® bandage does not need to be changed daily. It should be changed if dirty or if the bandage is falling off.

How to apply Duoderm®:

- 1. Wash and dry your hands.
- 2. Make sure the skin is clean and dry.
- 3. Remove Duoderm® from the package.
- 4. Cut the bandage to the size needed.
- 5. Remove the adhesive backing.
- 6. Apply the adhesive or sticky side to the skin.
