Green Zone: Doing Well	Give every day:			
No signs of asthma	MEDICINE:	HOW MUCH:	WHEN:	
<ul><li>Able to do normal activities</li><li>No problems while sleeping</li></ul>	(steroid/formoterol inhaler)			
* Rinse mouth after this medicine				
Yellow Zone: Watch Out	MEDICINE:	HOW MUCH:	WHEN:	
<ul><li>Cold symptoms</li><li>Coughing</li></ul>	(steroid/formoterol inhaler)			
<ul><li>Wheezing</li><li>Funny feeling in the chest</li><li>Child's first sign:</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Call your doctor or nurse if:</li> <li>You are not back in the Green Zone after 1 hour.</li> <li>Inhaler is needed more than every 4 hours.</li> <li>You are in the Yellow Zone more than 24 hours.</li> <li>More than puffs of steroid/formoterol inhaler are needed in 24 hours, including Green Zone doses.</li> <li>If under 12 years old, no more than 8 puffs in 24 hours.</li> <li>If 12 years or older, no more than 12 puffs in 24 hours.</li> <li>If steroid/formoterol inhaler is not available, 2–4 puffs of albuterol OR 1 nebulizer up to 3 times in the first hour, then every 4 hours as needed.</li> <li>Keep taking Green Zone medicines.</li> </ul>			
Red Zone: EMERGENCY	MEDICINE:	HOW MUCH:	WHEN:	
Late signs of asthma:		4 puffs	Immediately	
<ul> <li>Tightness in the chest</li> </ul>	(steroid/formoterol inhaler)			
<ul> <li>or constant coughing</li> <li>Breathing hard or fast</li> <li>Using neck or stomach muscles to breathe</li> <li>Trouble talking or walking</li> <li>Vomiting</li> <li>Blue lips or nails</li> </ul>	Call 911 or go to the nearest Emergency Department.  Call your child's provider when you can.			
	If steroid/formoterol inhaler is not available, give 6 puffs of albuterol OR 1 nebulizer treatment.
